We address challenges like cyberbullying, plagiarism, and over-sharing.



School-Specific Initiatives

Lomita Park Elementary

- Students learn to research on approved websites, avoid plagiarism, and communicate respectfully online
- Parent resources focus on social media safety and keeping privacy tips

Meadows Elementary

- Students will learn online responsibilities, including privacy and respectful communication
- Parent workshops cover managing devices and understanding technology's impact on children

Spring Valley Elementary

- Students learn how to manage online distractions and identify "safe" websites
- Students learn what appropriate forms of online communications
- Parent workshops on the risks of social media

Green Hills Elementary

- Students learn about time management and balancing screen time
- Students learn about the mental health impact of social media
- Students learn about cyberbullying and respectful technology use in classrooms

Taylor Middle School


- Students will learn about rules and how to self-regulate over Chromebook use in class
